Phonics and decoding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To read most words fluently and attempt to decode any unfamiliar words with increasing speed and skill, recognising their meaning through contextual cues To apply growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes/ word endings, including -sion, -tion, -cial, -tial, -ant/-ance/-ancy, -ent/-ence/-ency, -able/-ably and -ible/ibly, to read aloud fluently 			
Common exception words	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To begin to read Y5/Y6 exception words 			
Fluency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To read aloud a wider range of books and poetry written at an age-appropriate interest level with accuracy and at a reasonable speaking pace To read most words effortlessly To work out how to pronounce unfamiliar written words with increasing automaticity 			
Range of genres	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To read widely and frequently, outside as well as in school To read for pleasure To read for information To read an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference or textbooks To read books that are structured in different ways To read books including myths, legends and traditional stories, modern fiction, fiction from literary heritage and books from other cultures and traditions

Understanding and correcting inaccuracies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> With new words, learn both a word's meaning and its correct pronunciation To check that a book makes sense to them To ask questions to improve their understanding 			
Vocabulary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To infer the meaning of unfamiliar words To explore the meaning of words in context To discuss how authors use language to have an impact on the reader 			
Inference	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To draw inferences from texts To infer characters' feelings, thoughts and motives To justify inferences with evidence (sometimes from different places in the text) 			
Prediction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To predict what might happen from details stated using evidence To make predictions based on details implied, using evidence 			
Retrieval	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know where to search in a text to retrieve information To retrieve and record information from a range of texts 			
Summarise	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To identify and succinctly summarise the main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph To identify and recognise themes within a wide range of books 			
Explain	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To participate in discussions about books that are read to them and those they can read for themselves, building on their own and others' ideas To recommend texts to peers based on personal choice To make comparisons within books To make comparisons across books To explain how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning To distinguish between statements of fact and opinion To use formal presentations and debates to explain and discuss their understanding of what they have read To provide justifications for their views 			
Poetry and performance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To learn a wide range of poetry by heart To prepare poems to read aloud To prepare plays to read aloud and perform To continually show an awareness of the audience when reading out loud using intonation, tone and volume so that the meaning is clear 			
Non-fiction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To read and discuss non-fiction books at an age-appropriate level To retrieve, record and present information from non-fiction
